While on the mission trip, I used my craftsmanship to help build a church and prepare a school for students for the upcoming year.

During this mission trip one of the top life changing events that I participated in was when a group of us went out on the streets of Winslow looking for those in need. The poor that we encountered embraced our brown bag lunches and welcomed our kind words. One middle aged disheartened homeless man singled me out to pray with him.
